Lev Vladislavovitch Pioulsky, Russian, was born on October 25, 1905 at Mogilev, Russia. According to his own statement, he left Russia in 1923 and subsequently resided in Harbin. In 1925 he joined Marshal Chang Chung Chang's Army in which he served until 1927 when the army was disbanded. In 1927 he arrived in Shanghai from Tsingtao and in March of the same year joined the Russian Regiment, S.V.C. On March 31, 1929 he left the Regiment of his own accord and later worked casually until March 1930 when he was engaged as a chauffeur by Mr. B. Julien, proprietor of the pharmacie Generale, 949 - 951 Avenue Joffre. In November 1938 his

services were dispensed with owing to Mr. Julien's departure for France. In May 1939 the applicant secured a position as an Anti-Piracy Guard with Jardine, Matheson & Company, Ltd., but was dismissed on November 3, 1939 for neglect of duty.
